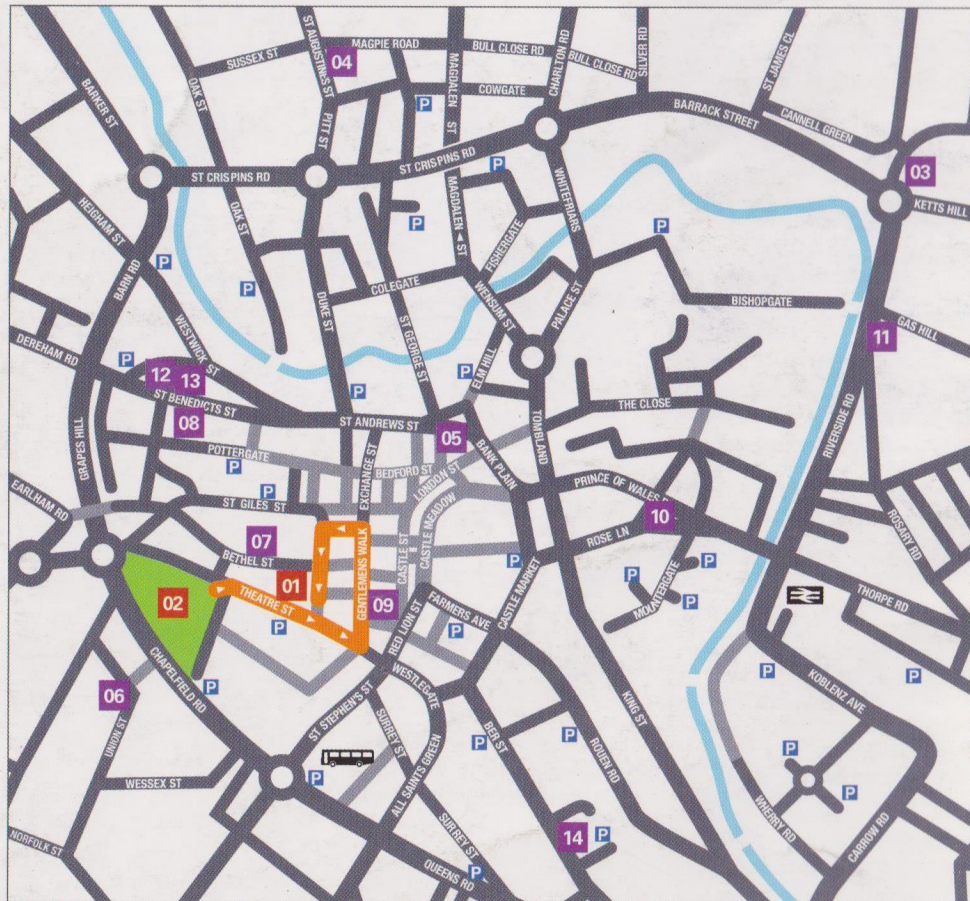

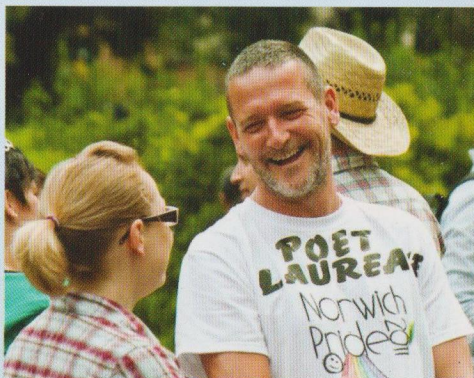
## PRIDE VILLAGE

Listen out for the bell of the Norwich Town Crier as he calls you to the bandstand to gather for the Parade. It will be launched by The Lord Mayor of Norwich, Councillor Ralph Gayton. This year the Parade will be organised in coloured sections to ensure there is music and entertainment throughout. We'll be led by the Norwich Samba Band and their dancers and you'll also find the Dun Dun Band, Golden Star Morris and Oxblood Molly Dancers and a portable PA from Pride Live! amongst the crowds. The Norfolk Association of Disabled LGBT People invite people using wheelchairs and scooters, with mobility problems and sensory impairments, to join them at the front of the parade. Look out for the Access Stewards in pink jackets if you need extra support.

A Pride favourite, Eileen has a stunning voice and stage charisma that always leaves audiences wanting more of her reggae style and well-known covers.





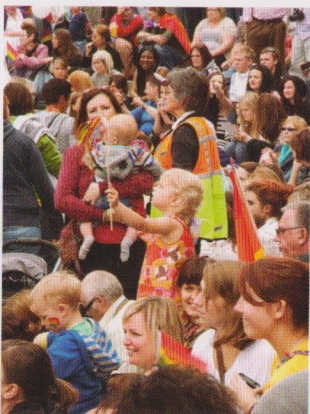

## ACCESS AT NORWICH PRIDE

Norfolk Association of Disabled LGBT People is working in partnership with Norwich Pride to make this year's celebrations as accessible as possible. We have written a page on Access at [www.norwichpride.org.uk](http://www.norwichpride.org.uk) that includes information such as locations of Blue Badge parking spaces in Norwich. You can meet members of the Association at our stall inside the Forum. Here are some of the key things we've arranged with Norwich Pride:

- Disabled people and carers are invited to meet in a safe space at the Chapelfield Bandstand and join us at the front of the parade.
- Access Stewards with disability training will be available all day to make sure we can get around and find what we need as easily as possible. Look out for their pink high-visibility vests.
- We have got a reserved space on top of the steps in front of the stage outside the Forum where we should have a clear view of the show.
- Rest area with comfortable sofas on the 2nd floor of the library inside the Forum for disabled people, elders and others who need it

- Help Desk outside the Forum with information on Shopmobility, location of disabled toilets and other useful information
- British Sign Language (BSL) interpreters
